Storage Solutions to Consider

Work Bench - Gives you surface space to work as well to store some of your supplies
Pegboard - Allows you to use vertical space & keeps items visible. Good for hand tools, rakes, etc.
Shelving - Add shelving unit to use vertical space. Can place medium or large bins on shelves to contain larger Items. Repurpose an old bookcase or cubby unit to store any cans, bottles or loose items.
Plastic Bins - Can use small baskets, bins or drawers to keep smaller items organized. Think dollar store finds! You can place them on top of the work bench for easy access or on any shelves.
Jars - Good for organizing small items. Clear jars allow you to easily see contents. Don't throw out those empty tomato sauce jars!
5-Gallon Buckets - Great for soils, seeds, or larger hand tools if you do not have a pegboard
Small Caddy/Bucket for Carrying Items - Having a caddy with a handle allows you to throw items in there and easily carry them to wherever you need to do your gardening work
Hose/Cord Organizer - Attaching these to the wall will allow you to keep those cords and hoses off the floor to prevent trips and falls or simply give you more floor space to maneuver

Shed Solutions

Determine where to store your items based on how often you will use an item. Items that are frequently used should be easily accessible.

Try your best to store similar items together so it is easier to find them when you need them.
